Sanctified Separation from Sinful Humanity

DEVOTIONALS FOR THE WEEK OF:

June 7, 2026

Let's dig deeper into the meaning of just how sinful sin is; as well as what it means to be separated from sin unto God's holy work.

Monday: Genesis 6:5-9; Jeremiah 17:9; Romans 5:12

A few generations passed from sin entering the world. Had things improved in that time? How far had sin spread? Was it just an occasional sin or pervasive? Why do you suppose that was the case? Why does it seem that left to our own devices we choose to sin rather than choose to be holy? Today, process this thinking and talk to God about your sin. Come clean and ask Him to forgive you and point you in the right direction.

Tuesday: Genesis 6:8-22; 7:1-7

Was everyone on the face of the earth evil all the time? What was different about Noah? What did he do when spoke. What about you? When God speaks to you, do you automatically say yes, or look for ways to get out of obeying? What did God have Noah build? Why was that such a strange thing to build? (Remember that the flood waters had not yet burst forth from the deep). What do you suppose his neighbors thought of him building a boat when they did not know about rain or floods? Today, is God speaking to you about something and you are balking at it? Why? Trust and watch how God works.

Wednesday: Genesis 7:8-24; 8:1

Why was this passage a miracle that was beyond human ability? What are the miracles that you see in the passages? How could wild animals and natural predators co-exist peacefully? How could both a male and female of each animal show up at the same time? How did Noah close and seal the door against the water? Was this a local flood? How many days did they survive on the boat? Why do you think the boat did not capsize? Think about what it means when God's mind is attentive to you. Can anything disrupt God's will in your life? Today, thank God for His hand on your life.

Thursday: Genesis 8:2-19

How did the flood subside? What does it mean to you that the fountains of the deep and the windows of heaven closed? Where is all that water? What happened to the ark when the floods stopped? How long before everything was dry enough to leave the ark? What did the family of Noah do? What did the animals do? Do you think that the animals scattered or did they all stay together?

Friday: Genesis 8:20-22; Genesis 6:5

Why did Noah offer burnt offerings of animals after caring for them and keeping them alive during the flood? What kind of animals were sacrificed? What is a covenant promise? What did God promise in the covenant? Why was such a covenant necessary? For how long was the covenant valid? Today, think about the seasons and thank God for His watchcare all year long.

Saturday: Genesis 9:1-17; Exodus 29:12; Deuteronomy 12:23; Matthew 26:28

How did God bless Noah and his family? While the animals were on the ark, they were peacefully co-existing. Did that continue after the ark? Why or why not? What changed about the diets of the animals and Adam and his family? What was the stipulation about eating meat? Why is blood forbidden to be eaten? What is supposed to happen to the blood? Why is blood holy? What does it mean to eat blood? How did Christ's blood change our spiritual state? Today, thank God for His atoning blood.
