The Church Ordinances

Church ordinances are: "Christian rites associated with tangible elements (water; oil, bread and the cup), that are celebrated by the church of Jesus Christ which are an outward and visible sign of an inward, mysterious and invisible grace." - The Gospel Coalition Eastern Orthodoxy has sacraments and Roman Catholics have sacraments, and they believe that by observing them they are saved. Most Protestant denominations only see ordinances - Baptism and Communion. Ephesians 2:8-9 "For by grace you have been saved through And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast." Anabaptists are a third wave that have ordinances to follow. **Anointing**: James 5:14-15 "Are any of you sick...call for the elders and after... anointing with oil in the name of the Lord, the Lord will raise him up." **Laying on of hands**: Paul often laid hands on and prayed for the called to do ministry person. **Foot washing**: To wash someone's feet, is a symbol of toward others. **Communion**: When you come together, break bread to ______ Christ's death. **Baptism**: The Greek word for baptism is 'baptizo' = to immerse completely as a public declaration to the world that a person is following Christ. The word Anabaptist means to baptize after making a profession of faith in Jesus Christ earlier.
