ADMINISTRATION: To steer the ministry toward the successful completion of God-given goals with planning, organization, and supervision.

APOSTLE/MISSIONARY: One sent forth to new places with the gospel.

CRAFTSMANSHIP: Use of your hands and mind through artistic creativity.

DISCERNMENT: Wisdom to recognize truth from untruth.

EVANGELISM: The ability to successfully communicate the message of the gospel to unbelievers.

EXHORTATION/ENCOURAGEMENT: To encourage, comfort, and support someone be all that God wants them to be.

FAITH: Great confidence in the power and promises of God, no matter how impossible it may seem.

GIVING: The gift of sharing not only money but other resources. to act as stewards over material resources in the Body of Christ.

HEALING: A capability to restore others, be that physically, emotionally, mentally, or spiritually.

HELPS: To assist members of the body of Christ so that they may be free to minister to others.

HOSPITALITY: To make people feel welcome in one's own home or church

KNOWLEDGE: To pursue and analyze biblical data so others in a clear concise way so people can be trained and instructed to edify the Body.

LEADERSHIP: To stand before and lead a church with vision, service and care to impart direction and goals to fulfill the churches goals.

MERCY: To compassionately help, comfort, encourage, support and build up God's suffering people.

MIRACLES: To perform supernatural acts to authenticate the power of God.

MUSIC: To contribute to the worship experience through singing, or playing a musical instrument.

PASTOR/SHEPHERD: To spiritually care for, protect, guide and spiritually feed a group of believers.

PROPHECY: In the days before Scripture it involved visions of what was to come. Today it is to tell forth what God is saying in Scripture.

SERVING: To identify tasks needed to support the weak and needy and to meet their needs using available resources to get the job done.

SPEAKING IN TONGUES The supernatural ability to speak a known tongue in a language that has not been learned to communicate a divinely anointed message from God to unbelievers.

INTERPRETATION OF TONGUES:The ability to translate unknown languages so as to edify and instruct others regarding what has been said in a tongue to God.

TEACHING: The skill to teach from the Bible and communicate it effectively for the understanding and spiritual growth of others.

WISDOM: The ability to make wise decisions when the church needs to choose but has no specifically clear information on the best choice.
